In 2020 Upper Allen Township (UAT) purchased a 60.9-acre parcel of land off McCormick Road with the intention of developing it into a public park. In March 2021, UAT hired a professional landscape architecture and engineering firm to develop a Master Plan for the public park. As part of the master planning process, a series of public input sessions was conducted where residents were asked to vote on preferred park amenities. The number one response from the public was walking/biking trails.

In the Governor's 2020-2024 Pennsylvania Outdoor Recreation Plan, trails continue to dominate feedback provided on how to improve outdoor recreation in the Commonwealth. More than 75% of the Commonwealth's Public Input respondents identified community or regional trail systems as their highest priority for facility investment.

Both Upper Allen Township and Cumberland County's population continue to grow exponentially. Comparing the 2010 and 2020 census data, UAT's population has grown 28% and Cumberland County's has increased by close to 10%. Growth areas such as this one, are faced with the exciting challenge of ensuring that trails and multi modal connections are not lost between communities. Growth also means more pressure on existing recreation resources and requires smart investment in new facilities.

Cumberland County's Recovery Grant Program uniquely positions UAT and Cumberland County to strategically partner in meeting residents' demand to provide welcoming, safe, inclusive, and accessible recreational infrastructure for all.

Our proposed project features over one mile of stabilized 8-foot-wide ADA compliant path connections and parking. Each year, UAT allocates money in its budget to benches. We plan to add park benches with extra space to the side so residents and guests who require mobility aids can rest comfortably while enjoying the park. For your reference, we have attached a site map and a vehicular and pedestrian circulation map from the master plan with the areas that we plan to develop through this project highlighted.

Description of the cost line items from the budget section details:

Site Mobilization Cost: \$21,120.60

Description: Assembly and setting up for the project, contractor's necessary general plant, including offices, field office, shops, plants, storage areas, sanitary and any other facilities. Costs required for insurance, bonds, and other initial expenses

Description: Network of natural and semi-natural systems that manage stormwater runoff by slowing the rate of water flow and filtering out harmful pollutants before they drain into waterways

8" 2A Base Stone Aggregate

Cost: \$57,420

Description: Placement of PennDOT 2A stone aggregate for construction of a stable subbase on a 12-foot-wide access drive and onsite parking areas

Paved Trail Cost: \$357,750

Description: Placement of six inches of PennDOT 2A stone aggregate for construction of a stable subbase for an eight-footwide walking trail that includes a 2-inch layer of bituminous asphalt pavement

Boardwalk Cost: \$80,000

Description: Eco-friendly trail continuation to preserve identified

wetland area.

This project's deliverables meet all three of the County's policy goals: 1) infrastructure through construction of recreational trails and green infrastructure; 2) promoting mental and physical health services to underserved populations, and 3) COVID-19 recovery through providing a safe, clean and well-maintained space for residents and guests to gather as society's behavior has collectively shifted towards outdoor recreation.

The Township plans to display proper acknowledgement signage for our funding partners.

What do you plan to accomplish with the project?*

Identify problems that need to be solved

This project gives UAT and Cumberland County an opportunity to build on their reputations as leaders in creating safe and clean parks that appeal to regional visitors of all walks of life and abilities. This project will connect community residents to close-to-home recreational opportunities and green space while reconnecting people to the outdoors through recreational experiences.

According to research done by Penn State University (2019 Spring Lion Poll), more than 9 out of 10 Pennsylvanians participated in at least some outdoor recreation activity over the last year. Over half of Pennsylvanians participated in outdoor recreation at least once or twice per month.

The data outlined in the project narrative details the boom in local population growth and demonstrates an increased demand for outdoor recreational facilities. As this area's population continues to grow, the number of people with mobility issues continues to climb. Almost one quarter of adults in Pennsylvania have some type of disability. Providing access to facilities for all people and underserved populations can present a myriad of challenges. In a recent survey conducted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania nearly half of local recreation providers indicated providing inclusive facilities for persons with disabilities being a significant or major challenge.

Additionally, this project is the next step in maintaining the Township's commitment to providing high-quality parks and open spaces to its residents and guests. This project will also assist the Township in attaining some of the goals laid out in its 2016 Comprehensive Parks, Recreation & Open Space Plan by providing recreation opportunities that balance the protection of open space and natural resources with the need for passive recreation facilities and space while continuing to maintain parks to an unparalleled standard.

This project accomplishes meeting county policy priorities and our residents' stated desire for safe and well planned multi modal recreational facilities, expanding a sense of belonging for all our residents and guests.

What outcome do you expect to deliver with the project?*

This park project is a large long-term investment that will pay its users and the community back in dividends as it meets all three of the County's policy goals for funding (infrastructure, mental and physical health, and COVID-19 recovery). In order to summarize this as an outcome: This project creates and strengthens connections between outdoor recreation and health in our community for people of all ages and abilities.

Understanding our community's background and issues helps target the use of limited resources. UAT believes that this project will uncover barriers to realization of the full positive physical and mental health impacts through the addition of green and recreational infrastructure.

Recreational interests and needs between groups vary.

Appropriately addressing these needs will increase our community's resiliency. In the past, UAT placed emphasis on connecting youth to safe and clean sport fields, playgrounds, and other facilities. In recent years, gaining the insight that green spaces offer flexibility and inclusiveness to groups with alternative traditions in physical activity and cultural views of natural settings; UAT has prioritized supporting diverse and underserved populations, and encouraging multi-generational experiences through recreational infrastructure.

If funded, an existing contractor who employs a 5- to 10-person construction crew would be engaged during the active construction period of this project.

As additional recreational assets have come online in the previous years, the Township has adjusted the annual budgets to ensure proper maintenance and to make sure all visitors experience a clean and safe park. The Township's labor force will benefit by continued stable employment from the continued and deferred maintenance provided by this project. There will be an ongoing additional need to properly maintain the area for public use.

On July 20, 2022, Derck & Edson will give a public presentation of the final master plan at the Township's Board of Commissioner's meeting, providing a near shovel ready project.

If awarded funding, UAT plans to bid the project late winter 2022 in preparation for an early April 2023 project start date. The contract period would be set to 180 days.

We have attached a copy of the master plan as supplement to this application. Additionally, we would like to extend an invitation to all County stakeholders in this award process to attend the July 20th public meeting.

We plan to follow the timeline sequenced below:

- 1. Put Project out to Bid: Winter 2022
- 2. Project Start Date: April 2023
- 3. Topsoil Removal/Stockpiling: May 2023
- 4. Site Excavation/placement of fill material: May 2023-June 2023
- 5. Placement of Stone Aggregate Subbase: June 2023-July 2023
- 6. Placement of Bituminous Pavement: July 2023- September 2023
- 7. Finish Grading/Seeding: September 2023-October 2023
- 8. ADA Compliant Benches: October 2023

As a near shovel-ready project that UAT has a pre-vested interest in following through to completion, UAT does not anticipate any funding or regulatory issues that may affect its ability to complete the project.

We currently have the NPDES permit in place for the driveway portion of the project. The Township engineer plans to modify the existing permit to accommodate the improvements proposed in this project.

In the event of unfavorable market conditions, such as supply chain issues and/or material/labor shortages, UAT is in a position to phase this project into multiple segments if necessary.

How will this project be sustained or maintained after the grant is expended?*

UAT is committed to properly maintaining this site in the future and ensuring that is open and accessible to the public throughout its useful life. Future management and maintenance of the Township's Park facilities will be supported through the continual funding of the Parks Department in the Township's annual General Fund Budget. In addition to capital expenditures, budget funding for this department has increased as priorities have changed, and the Township continues to expand and develop its park system (2018=\$442,053; 2019=\$517,966; 2020=\$425,088; 2021=\$416,198; 2022=\$622,000).

Township maintenance crews sustain over 200 acres of park land throughout the year using a combination of permanent staff and seasonal help. During the past three years Upper Allen Township has spent \$429,941 (in park operation and capital purchases) in support of Township-owned parks and has budgeted another \$282,000 to continue support in 2022 (total does not include funds spent from the collection of developer recreation fees).

The Township is committed to providing the local communities maintained, well-equipped, and beautifully landscaped parks for years to come. As part of its commitment to continual improvement of Township parks, the Board of Commissioners established an annual recreation real estate tax. The real estate tax is set at .1 mill in 2022 and strictly used for direct use capital improvements. Revenue collected from this tax are spent on new playgrounds, land purchases, and other miscellaneous park improvements. General maintenance is not supported from these dedicated tax revenues.

Since its inception, the revenues from this fund have supported installation of new walking paths, refurbished playgrounds, and constructed a dog park. Upper Allen Township is committed to maximizing limited dollars to create long lasting recreational opportunities at its parks and schedules, plans and saves specifically for the upkeep of its outdoor assets.

Please describe how this project benefits underserved populations?*

Populations that experience barriers to access services or life needs including populations underserved because of geographic location, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity, underserved racial and ethnic populations, populations underserved because of special needs (such as language barriers, disabilities, alienage status, or age.)

UAT will make efforts to increase accessibility everywhere it can for this project. It is UAT's position that every resident and guest should be able to safely access the trails regardless of ability.

UAT has been working to increase access and equity for people of all ages and abilities. The project we are proposing expands the recreational opportunities of this park beyond those who are involved in youth sports or are without physical disabilities. It is designed to be inviting to anyone who is looking for an inclusive recreational opportunity.

The construction of the trail system outlined in this proposal centers on ease of access from the very beginning and if funded is expected to be a welcoming accessible facility for people of all abilities for many years into the future.

This project will also feature park benches with four feet of extra space to the side so residents who require mobility aids can rest comfortably while out soaking in nature and in the future enjoying the park facilities.

In summary, this project allows for further diversification and opportunities for the end users of the park while catering to an underserved population in Cumberland County.

How will this project help to limit the spread of COVID-19 or assist in the recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic?*

Public parks and trails are widely recognized as essential for health and wellness, reducing anxiety, stress, and depression and improving physical health. Awarding funding for this project will help assist in the recovery of the COVID-19 public health emergency by strengthening overall population health of county residents through outdoor recreational infrastructure.

The COVID-19 pandemic in conjunction with its resulting economic downturn has adversely affected overall population health. The pandemic brought to light existing barriers for people who suffer from mental illness and generated new obstacles to addressing these.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), global prevalence of anxiety and depression increased by 25% over the last two years. As of 2021-year end, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) declared that an alarming 1 in 4 persons in the U.S. have reported symptoms of anxiety or depressive disorder.

The community lockdowns which were implemented to contain the spread of COVID-19 contributed to decreased overall physical health, fostering physical inactivity and a lack of engagement in wellness activities. As both the mental and physical health fallout from the pandemic continue, necessary public health interventions must be taken to minimize poor health outcomes.

Emerging evidence demonstrates that recreational infrastructure spaces have a positive influence on mental, emotional, and behavioral health by preventing or mitigating the impact of stress anxiety and depression. Study after study in the public health and mental health communities reinforce why making it simple and accessible for people to spend time outdoors positively influences

our collective society translating into our community's residents.

Providing access to safe places for physical activity such as parks and trails encourages the community to participate in physical activity and do so more often. The physical activity our residents get from recreating in our parks provides physical health benefits such as weight control, lowered risk of chronic disease, strengthening bones and muscles and reduced healthcare costs associated with these issues.

Residents count on local government leadership to assist with recovery support from pandemic fallout. This project will foster our community's resilience now more than ever as our residents turn to our recreational infrastructure like never before- fresh air, exercise, walking, biking, meditation, solace with nature. During quarantine, public parkland saw some of its highest usage in modern times, proving it an essential part of how people cope and recover from the public health crisis.

The COVID-19 pandemic created what is known today across the country as the "Pandemic Trail Boom". According to the Rails to Trails Conservancy, trail use skyrocketed 79% in 2020. In the absence of trail counter technology in our parks, it's difficult to quantify data for local governments; however, our data and technology driven society illustrates compelling statistics.

The American Trails Organization provides studies to support the boom through aggregating average monthly trail counts across the country. Additionally, data collected in the consumer economy suggests the societal shift in behavior as well. In the U.S. bicycle sales climbed 65%, indicating additional demand for safe multimodal transportation facilities. Technology company Garmin compiles all the data collected by its smart watches shows that as of 2021, outdoor trail activity has increased over 21% since its 2019 numbers.
